
Global Rivals Have Significantly More Mid-Band

The U.S. continues to trail leading countries in available licensed mid-band spectrum, a trend expected to continue for the foreseeable future. Today, the U.S. lags its peers by an average of 198 megahertz in mid-band access. That means our peers have access today to 44% more mid-band. By 2027, the U.S. deficit will actually grow to 115% absent swift government action.

Comparatively, the U.S. has far more unlicensed mid-band spectrum than any other country. Only two countries plan to make more unlicensed spectrum available in the next five years and both will continue to trail the U.S. The U.S. is also an outlier as the only country to make unlicensed spectrum available between 3.3 GHz and 4.2 GHz.
